4 yearly review of modern awards—*Pharmacy Industry Award 2010* (AM2019/17)

MELBOURNE, 29 NOVEMBER 2019

- [1] A Statement¹ issued on 8 October 2019 noted that the Pharmacy Guild of Australia (PGA) had raised a number of issues regarding the Plain Language Draft Variation Determination (the PL Draft) in submissions dated 15 March 2019 and 18 September 2019 and referred the matters raised to a conference before the President.
- [2] The PGA submission dated <u>15 March 2019</u> was based on the plain language exposure draft (PLED) published on <u>15 February 2019</u>. A number of points raised in the PGA submission were resolved in the revised PLED published on 2 September 2019.
- [3] A <u>Background Paper</u> published on 25 November 2019 identified the issues raised by the PGA which remain outstanding. A conference of interested parties was held on 26 November 2019. A transcript of the conference is here.
- [4] The following issues were resolved at the conference (clause references are to the 2 September 2019 revised PLED).
 - 1. Clause 18 (Annualised salary (pharmacist and pharmacy assistant level 4 only)): The revised PLED will be amended once the Annualised Salaries Full Bench has issued a variation determination (see [2019] FWCFB 4368 at [27]).
 - 2. Clause 19 Allowances and Schedule C Summary of Monetary Allowance:
 - There is an outstanding claim for a 'district allowance' (AM2014/190) in which the decision is reserved. Once the decision is issued the revised PLED will be amended to reflect the outcome of those proceedings.
 - In accordance with [2019] FWCFB 3949 at [12-13], an allowance for the performance of Home Medicine Reviews or Residential Medication Management Reviews will be included in the revised PLED.

- 3. Clause 22.3(b): This issue concerns the current wording of the annual leave loading provision. As noted in a decision by the Plain Language Full Bench ([2019] FWCFB 1255) this matter will be the subject of a further decision.
- 4. Schedule B.1.1, B.1.2 and B.2.1: To provide for greater consistency between the tables in these schedules. Schedules B.1.2 and B.2.1 will be amended so that the second column becomes the first column. A copy of the varied schedules is at **Attachment 1**. (Note the wage rates have also been updated.)
- [5] There remains an outstanding issue regarding consistency of terminology in respect of rates of pay and allowances (see [2019] FWCFB 1255 at [59] [71]). The PGA will put a proposal to the SDA in respect of this issue and will file a report setting out the views of the parties by no later than **4pm** on **Friday 13 December 2019**. The report will be published and a further conference convened.
- [6] A revised Pharmacy Award PLED will be published in the next few weeks.
