Dear Associate

AM2014/196 & 197 - Part-Time and Casual Employment

We refer to the above proceedings and the hearings listed for 11-15 July 2016 and confirm we act for Australian Business Industrial and the NSW Business Chamber Ltd.

Please find **attached** five draft *Orders Requiring Production of Documents etc. to the Fair Work Commission* (**draft Orders**) which our clients respectfully request be made by the Commission.

We set out below a summary of the grounds in support of the making of the Orders:

- 1. The variation sought by our clients relates to a requirement that employers agree with part-time employees their regular pattern of work including the number of hours worked, days worked and starting and finishing times.
- 2. In respect of the witness statements of Ms Bady, Ms Gamble and Ms Bookallil, those statements refer to written employment agreements or otherwise contain information about the terms of their employment and the nature of their working hours. Our clients have sought copies of the employment agreements of those witnesses in order to properly understand the nature of their employment arrangements.
- 3. In respect of the witness statements of Mr Wiengard and Ms Furtado, their statements refer to a survey that was conducted of ASU members, and makes certain assertions about the findings of that survey, although the statements do not attach the actual results of the survey (either in a summary form or in full). Our clients have sought copies of the complete survey results in order to properly understand and interrogate the findings of the survey and to test the generic assertions contained in the witness statements regarding the results.
- 4. By letter dated 27 June 2016, our office requested the abovementioned documents from the ASU.
- 5. By letter dated 30 June 2016, the ASU declined to provide any documents on the bases that:
 - a. the documents sought contained confidential information; and
 - b. some of the information contained in certain documents was not relevant to the proceedings.
- 6. By letter of 30 June 2016, our office advised that it would be willing to enter into appropriate confidentiality undertakings regarding the use of the documents.
- 7. By letter dated 1 July 2016, the ASU again declined to provide all documents sought, stating that:
 - a. confidentiality undertakings will not provide sufficient protections;
 - b. it was not clear what sanction would apply where the undertakings were breached; and

c. even where the documents are redacted, the potential for identifying the survey participants would still be significant.

We attach the relevant correspondence between the parties for the Commission's reference.

In light of the above, our clients respectfully request the attached Orders be made compelling the production of documents relevant to the present proceedings.

We thank the Commission for its consideration of this request, and note that we have copied the relevant union representatives into this email.

We refer to the above proceedings and to your letter of today's date.

In your letter, the ASU has declined to provide all documents requested by our client. The bases for the ASU declining to provide the documents sought include:

- · concerns around the confidentiality of the documents; and
- an assertion that some of the information contained in certain documents is not relevant to the
 proceedings (although curiously you have not denied that some of the information contained in
 the documents is relevant).

Our clients restate their view that the documents are relevant to the issues in dispute in the proceedings and should be provided. We invite you to reconsider your position and, to this end, make the following comments:

- Our clients are happy to enter into appropriate confidentiality undertakings to address any
 concerns that you may have regarding confidentiality of certain documents or data.
 Alternatively, our clients are prepared to accept the survey data in a redacted or de-identified
 form if that would alleviate your concerns.
- On the question of relevance, the documents sought are clearly relevant to the issues for consideration in the proceedings. The witnesses have explicitly referred to the documents and have made comments about the documents in their statements.
- While it is trite that some of the information in the documents might not be relevant to the
 present proceedings, there will of course be other information which is clearly relevant to the
 proceedings. Our clients are interested in the information which is relevant. The fact that the
 documents contain information, some of which is not relevant, does not detract from the fact
 that the documents contain other information which is relevant.

• With respect, it would be a bizarre outcome if a party could legitimately decline to provide relevant documents on the basis that not *all* of the information contained in the documents is relevant.

While we hope this matter can be resolved efficiently, failing a change in the ASU's position our clients will seek orders from the Commission under section 590(2)(c) of the *Fair Work Act*. Our clients will also rely on this chain of correspondence in support of those applications.

The ASU refers to your correspondence of 30 June 2016.

The ASU notes that ABI as part of its request for documents now proposes:

- The possibility of appropriate confidential undertakings regarding confidentiality of particular documents; or
- The ASU to provide survey data in a redacted or de-identified form.

The ASU does not believe confidential undertakings will provide sufficient protections. From the ASU's viewpoint it is uncertain which organisation/s or person/s the confidentiality undertakings will cover. Further it is unclear what sanction, if any, would apply to an organisation or person who breached the confidentiality undertakings.

In regard to redacting or de-identifying data the ASU believes the potential for ascertaining the participants in the surveys will remain significant.
