RE: C2013/6333 & AM2018/4576 - Applications by the Independent Education Union of Australia

The AEU-Victorian Branch seeks leave from the Full Bench to intervene in relation to the above matters.

The AEU- Victorian Branch supports the IEU applications and urges the Commission to find that there has been substantial work value change in the work of Teachers justifying a substantial increase in the rates of pay under the *Educational Services (Teachers) Award 2010* (MA000077).

The AEU – Victoria has members who will be affected by any Order made by the Full Bench in relation to the IEU’s applications. The Victorian Branch of the AEU has coverage of early childhood teachers in Victoria except where they are employed by independent schools. The AEU coverage of early childhood teachers includes teachers who work in the long day care sector in Victoria. Officers of the AEU – Victorian Branch have also filed witness statements in this matter including, Ms Martel Menz and Ms Lily Ames.

If leave to intervene is granted by the Full Bench, the AEU – Victorian Branch intends to file written submissions once the evidence closes.
