The UWU supports the proposal by the HSU to delay the report back, but also the ANMF's proposal that a conference is listed for further timetabling on or after 31 March 2023.

In respect of the Stage 3 tranches proposed by the ANMF, and to clarify the UWU's position:

- We are open to further discussion in relation to the order/nature of the timetabling.
- We support the separation of indirect care evidence out from the other matters in dispute, and the proposal that such evidence is dealt with first.
- We wish to have further discussion regarding the proposed tranches, for example we would propose that submissions on the topic of indirect care occur before other evidence (and that such submissions are not left until after all evidence).
